

## Marjorie Miner Scholarship Established January 2011 Marjorie Miner Political Biography

Former Ahwatukee Foothills resident Marjorie Miner spent her life as a devout and knowledgeable registered Republican.

Marjorie (White) Miner became politically active in 1936 at 9 years of age when she supported the candidacy of Republican, Alfred Landon for President opposing Democrat incumbent Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Marjorie graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Secondary Education having a composite major in Political Science, History, and Sociology; Minor in English and Physical Ed.



While in college she was a member of the International Relations Club and a strong advocate for Military Installations in Alaska.

At age 21, she registered to vote as a Republican and has voted Republican in every election. She has been a Block Worker, Election Judge, Chairman of Shoshone County Republican Central Committee, Chairman of the Idaho Legislative District IV, Chairman of Idaho Region I, Vice-Chair of Idaho Republican Central Committee, and Chairman of Idaho Republican State Central Committee. During that time she was the only female in the continental US to be a State Chairman and also served on the National Executive Committee.

Marj was President of Shoshone County Republican Women's Club was a delegate to the 16th Biennial NFRW Convention and participated in a Good Will trip behind the Iron Curtain, which included West and East Berlin, Poland, St. Petersburg and Moscow, Hungary and Romania; also visiting Vienna, Austria and Paris. She also ran for election to a Senate seat in the Idaho State Legislature.

Marj was a Delegate to the 1972 Republican National convention in Miami, serving on the platform and rules committees; a Reagan Delegate to the 1976 Republican National convention in Kansas City, a member of the National Rule #29 Committee, a participant at the Institute of Politics Conference of State Party Chairmen at the JFK School of Government at Harvard University.

During the Reagan Administration, she lived in Washington D. C. and worked in the office of Idaho Senator, Steve Symms.



After moving to Arizona she worked at election polls for numerous elections, was elected President of the Tempe Republican Women's club, has been a Precinct and State Committeeman and a proud member of Ahwatukee Republican Women. In 2012 she was presented with the Lincoln Bust Award, the GOP's highest honor, for a lifetime of service to the party, especially in precinct work.
